

1 Roaming Roosters Education Centre BB12 9ER.



Roaming Roosters has opened the doors to its new education centre so more people can share the fun of the farm with us! Learn about our animals' life cycles and how looking after them well means better food on our plates. The Education Centre joins the bistro, farm shop and coffee room on our working farm here in rural Higham, so there's a lot to keep every age entertained. 2 Pendle Sculpture Trail BB12 9JX.



Explore our woodland near Barley and find bats, witches and owls! These are just some of the sculptures made of wood, stone and metal. One of the features of the trail is the ten ceramic plaques, each with an individual design representing the people who were hanged as witches over 400 years ago in Britain's biggest witchcraft trial. The famous Pendle Witches were the political and religious scapegoats of their day and a lot can be learned from them. The trail is set up like a treasure trail, where you have to match each witch to ten descriptions making learning about them fun. There are also other sculptures such as a giant arch and the evocative 'spirits of the wood'. The trail can be followed through a free brochure, or trained guides can be hired if required.


3 Whitehough Outdoor Education Centre BB12 9LF.

Located in Barrowford, The centre includes a museum packed with information about the history of the site, and the social and cultural history of the Pendle area, including the Pendle Witch Trials of 1612. There are interactive displays and a short film depicting the story of the Pendle Witches. Within the grounds there is an 18th Century walled garden, displaying a variety of plants from that era, and a 15th Century cruck barn.

A visit to Pendle Heritage Centre will be of interest to both primary and high schools and includes aspects across the entire curriculum, especially 'Learning Outside of the Classroom'.



Wycoller Country Park is great for educational activities. The country park ranger is based at Pepper Hill Barn Study Centre in the hamlet of Wycoller. The building is an excellent base from which to carry out educational studies of the history and natural history of this unique valley, with or without the assistance of the ranger and the equipment which is available to help with field study activities. With its medieval field boundaries, ancient bridges, 17th century vernacular architecture, a rare example of an aisled barn and an historic hall associated with Charlotte Brontë's novel 'Jane Eyre', the country park - with its varied habitats of woodland, ancient meadows, streams and ponds - offers great scope for history and natural history studies.
